

## FAQs about serving on the WVC Board

Women's Voices Chorus is a volunteer run organization. Therefore, any woman wishing to serve on the Board should understand that this Board is not an advisory board, but one in which she is committing to do a job which is essential to the success of the chorus.

Q: Where can I find information about Board composition, terms, responsibilities etc?
A: The Bylaws of WVC were adopted in November 2009 by the chorus membership and are updated annually. They contain a lot of details about what the Board is responsible for, how the Board works, and a description of the various jobs on the Board. Q: I've read the Bylaws, but still have questions. Who do I ask?
A: You can find out more by talking to people currently serving on the Board or the chair of the Nominating Committee.

Q: Will I be required or expected to donate money or raise money as part of my responsibilities in serving on the Board?

A: No. There is no requirement or expectation for fundraising or donating.

Q: When are meetings? Where? How long do they last?

A: The Board meets generally the second Sunday of most months, rotating among Board members' homes or via zoom. Meetings run from 7:00 to around 8:30 pm. There is an annual budget meeting that occurs in June that may last longer.

Q: Do I have to host Board meetings? I have kids and can't accommodate an evening meeting. A: No you don't have to host a meeting. There are many Board members that are able to accommodate the group. You may be asked to sign up to host OR provide refreshments for two meetings per year.
